The donor must be 70 1/2 or older. The gift must be made directly from the IRA to an eligible charitable organization. Gifts to all charities combined cannot exceed a total of \$100,000 per taxpayer for the year. The gifts must be outright, and no material benefits can be received in return for the gifts.
