General fruit tree planting guidelines are as follows: Plant where your fruit trees will receive at least six hours of sun a day during the growing season. Sun should not be blocked by buildings, fences or other obstacles. Plant at least three feet from sidewalks and driveways and six feet away from buildings, as roots will spread wider than the tree crown. Allow ten to fifteen feet of space between fruit trees.

3. Remove branches growing inwards to improve air circulation 4. Trees should grow up to 3 metres tall, this makes fruit picking easier and pest and disease control more manageable 5. If you have trees that are really out of control and have been left unmanaged for years you can be quite severe with them and can prune half the tree back.

Fruit Tree and Bush Care Instructions

Use a shovel to dig a hole twice as wide as the spread of the roots of the tree you're planting. Fruit trees' roots tend to grow outward, and this will give them plenty of room. Make sure that the roots are surrounded by loose soil so that they are not challenged by compressed earth. At the same time, it's important not to dig the hole too deep.

Fruit trees benefit from regular fertiliser. There are many types of fertiliser available, all with different nutrient values. Make sure that the soil is moist - late winter or early spring is best ; If the tree is growing in grass, it is best to remove a 1m (3¼ft) wide ring from around the base and lightly forking over the soil before feeding

Do not plant trees near wooded areas or trees. The ideal soil pH is 6.0 to 6.5 but a pH range of 5.5 to 7.0 is acceptqable. Take a soil test prior to planting your apple trees. Water newly planted trees whenever the top 2 inches of soil are dry. As the plants develop more extensive root systems, you can water less often—but keep in mind that, to produce a juicy crop, all fruit trees must have periodic deep soaking (provided either by rain or by you). Fruit trees grow and fruit best in sunny positions, and where possible you should try and plant them in these positions. Part shade during the early morning and late afternoon is acceptable, provided the fruit trees receive sunlight during the rest of the day.

Growing deciduous fruit trees: apples, pears and ...

Fig trees need a sunny spot in your yard that classifies as receiving full sun to partial shade. Fruit trees need as much sun as they can possibly soak in to produce the greatest amount of fruit; a minimum of 7 to 8 hours of sun exposure is recommended. With fig trees, less sun still means the tree does well but your fruit yields will be reduced.
